THE MUSSEL INSPECTION KIOSK AT THE HROA MARINA

The Mussel inspection kiosk opens on Saturdays and Sundays for the spring and summer boating season, effective the weekend of April 1, 2022. Kiosk hours for mussel inspections:

- 1. Saturday, 8:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m.
- 2. Sunday, 8:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m.

For additional information, please contact the Member Services Office. Decals will be available at the kiosk. Guest boats are welcome, but they must be pre-paid and pre-registered at the HROA office during operationing hours (see general information below for hours).

HROA BOATING INFORMATION

We are continuing the home mussel inspection program. Please come to the office Monday-Friday to get set up on the mussel program. At this time, weekend inspections are not available. The kiosk is expected to open on April 1, 2023 All boats using the HROA boat slips and docks, and/or mooring on the shore, must have a current HROA mussel inspection. Contact the HROA Member Services office to schedule an inspection with the mussel team if you plan to occupy a rental slip, dock, or moor on the shoreline. Drop-in inspections are available at the Member Services office Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm.

Party Dock – Party Dock B is available for rent. Watch for announcements on the status of Party Dock A. A lottery system will be used for all holiday weekends. Party Dock B is rented on a weekly basis, from a Tuesday through the following Monday. It also has a daily option, with a minimum of three (3) days. Ask the HROA office if you have rental questions.

Boat Slip Rentals for Off-Season

Seventeen (17) boat slips are available for long-term rental from October through mid-May. Three slips are available for weekly rental only. Contact the HROA office with any questions.

Boat Slip Lottery for the Peak Season, beginning May 16, 2023

Seventeen (17) boat slip rentals are assigned by a lottery drawing for a period of four (4) weeks. Following the Off-Season Lottery, the summer lottery will start the first four weeks on May 16 (Drawing May 9). Lottery instructions are now available. Applications will be accepted starting April 10, 2023. All lottery applicants must complete a boat slip rental form per lottery. Four (4) week blocks assigned through a random-picker lottery. See below for 2024 lottery dates:

Monterey County Day Lake Permits are available at the iron rangers located at the Main Gate and HROA Marina. Annual permits may be purchased by calling the Lake Nacimiento Resort at 805-237-4924 and choosing the Reservations option. This phone number may go straight to a VM system. Members should leave a message and with their name and contact information to receive a call back from one of the County staff within 24 hours. 2023 GUEST BOATS

Guest Boats definition: Visitor Boats that WILL launch at our launch ramp.

- The number of guest boats allowed to launch per day has returned to 50 Guest boats (Rules & Regulations 3.02.03, Page 36).
- All Guest Vessels MUST pre-register and pre-pay through the HROA Office or Mussel Inspection Kiosk prior to launch.
- Fees (subject to change): Daily Rate (M-F): \$20.00 per day. Weekend rate: \$40.00 (this does not include Friday)
 - All weekend guest vessels are required to pay for both Saturday and Sunday.
- Guest Vessels are currently allowed to enter the HROA community and use the HROA launch ramp.
- All Guest Vessel vehicles and trailers must park in overflow and remain hitched together. No parking in the Marina Parking
 lot for guest vehicles unless the signage posted allows guest parking. Please make sure to read all parking notices at the
 fish cleaning station at the campground entrance.

VISITOR BOATS

Visitor Boats (Boats that WILL NOT launch at our launch ramp and will go to the Main Marina)

- Visitor Vessels are allowed to enter the HROA community in order to park at Member/Tenant residences.
- Visitor Vessels cannot receive HROA mussel inspections or launch from the HROA launch ramp.
- Visitor Vessels will not use the HROA Marina amenities or overflow parking lot areas and will simply park on-property to visit for a temporary period of time in order to launch at the Main Marina.

HROA SPECIAL ASSESSMENT

At the Special Meeting of the Board of Directors held on November 11, 2022, it was discussed and decided to implement a special assessment for the repair of the Comanche Spillway. The total cost of the project is anticipated not to exceed \$250,000. The special assessment will cover approximately 60% of this cost with the remaining expense to be paid from the Association's Reserve funds.

At the January 26, 2023 Meeting of the Board of Directors, the timing and dollar amount of the special assessment were defined. The special assessment will be \$75.00 per unit for a total of \$156,825.00. This may be paid in one lump sum or split into installments as may be necessitated by individual circumstances. The special assessment was due on March 1, 2023, however no late fees will be charged until July 1, 2023.

"FOREVER" DECALS INFORMATION

"Forever" decals for vehicles and vessels are available at the HROA Member Services Office. Below are some reminders for when you come into our office to pick-up your new decals:

- For brand-new vehicle or vessel, a decal will be issued once you have your permanent license plates. Newly purchased used vehicle with permanent plates can receive a decal with current registration.
- Newly purchased boats require proof of where the boat has been for the past 30 days and current issued registration to receive your decal. Temporary vessel registration is not accepted.

If you have received a forever decal that is fading or discolored, please contact the HROA member services office for a replacement. The Decal Manufacturer has now provided replacements for the decals that have faded.

RANCH PATROL FEBRUARY 2023 RECAP

During the month of February, Ranch Patrol as a collective handled:

- 1095 Dispatched calls and Officer Initiated Activities (amenity checks, resident contacts, traffic enforcement, noise complaints, etc.)
- 14 Incident reports were written
- 58 Enforcement actions were initiated and categorized as follows:
 - 11 Verbal Warnings
 - 35 Written Warnings
 - 12 Violation Citations
 - 23 General conduct citations (illegal dumping, disturbing the peace, pets, AEC, fireworks, weed abatement)
 - 20 Vehicle related citations (moving violations, parking, off roading, speeding, reckless driving, DUI, etc.)
 - 15 Unsightly citations.

OFF-SEASON HROA CAMPING INFORMATION

The RV Campground, sites 1-14, and Tent Campground, sites 15-19 are currently open at full capacity. Both the completed forms and payment are required for a reservation. Online, fillable forms are now available at https://hroa.us/recreation/campgrounds.

During the Offseason (October 1-May 22), Campsites are available for up to 28 days (4-weeks). A 4-week RV rental does have a discounted rate. A break is required by all RVs and tents after a 28-day rental period. Tents are allowed in the RV campsites. Two Vehicles/Vessels plus the RV are allowed to park in the RV Campsites. Permits will be placed at the assigned location prior to the reservation date. No vehicles are permitted in the Tent campsites, including RVs or cabovers, and no sleeping in a vehicle at a tent side is allowed. All vehicles must park in the designated spots. Maximum capacity per site is 7 people, and each site can accommodate up to 1 10x10 tent or two small single backpacking tents.

Welfare Check Registration

The Emergency Services Committee (ESC) has developed a formal workbook with specific protocols and procedures for HROA, CSD, and ESC volunteers to conduct Welfare Checks for those who have special health care needs or impaired mobility. This service is only provided in the event of a major incident and upon activation of the Heritage Ranch Community Major Incident Response Plan (MIRP).
